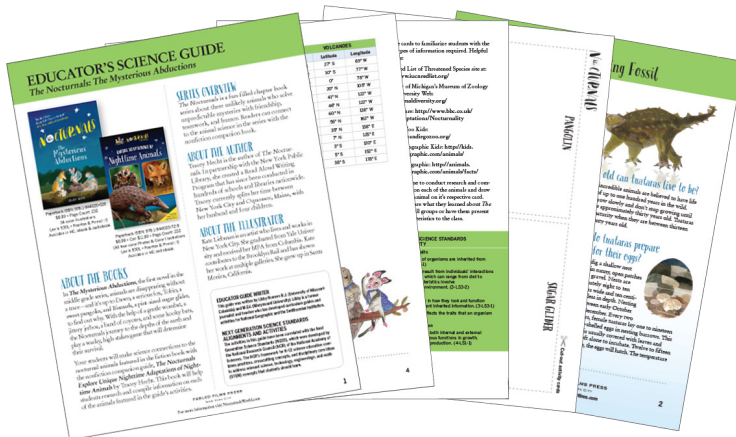

The stories all play out in their nighttime world with teamwork, friendship, and humor in every adventure. All the adventures in *The Nocturnals* address social situations—such as bullying, accepting differences, and empathy—in an easy and acceptable way.

Each title is leveled by Fountas & Pinnell and Lexile, and *The Mysterious Abductions* and *The Ominous Eye* are available as an AR Quiz. The early reader books are appropriate for children 5-7, and the middle grade books for children 8-12.
