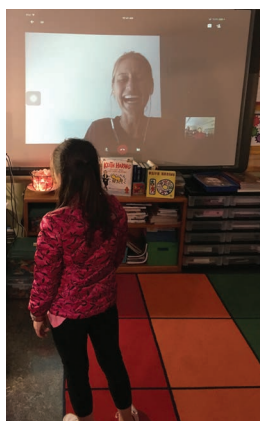

The Nocturnals SEL Workshop: *Learning Courage Through Stories*

Presentation is appropriate for children ages 5-8 | Time: 30 minutes plus Q&A time

Workshop Outline

Introduction

The Power of Stories

Tracey Hecht shares how stories help children learn and understand different SEL themes. She introduces her Grow & Read early reader books, *The Nocturnals*, which all feature Dawn the serious fox, Tobin the sweet pangolin, and Bismark the loud-mouthed sugar glider.

Section One

SEL Theme Spotlight: Courage

Hecht focuses on the specific SEL theme of courage. She provides the definition, synonyms, and different scenarios that display this theme, including trying new foods, moving to a new house, and standing up for friends.

Section Two

The Slithery Shakedown Storytime and Discussion Questions

Hecht reads chapter 3 and 4 of *The Slithery Shakedown*, a Grow & Read Level 2 book, where the Nocturnals meet a bullying snake and gain courage to stand up for themselves. Hecht invites students to think about how they would respond and what each character did to show courage.

Section Four

Real-Life Application

Students connect the story themes back to their own lives as Hecht takes them through different examples. She shares three situations where students can show courage in school, with friends, and to someone who isn't nice.

Section Five

Interactive Hand Drawing Activity

Students draw 5 examples from their own life displaying courage. Hecht provides a step-by-step example to inspire the students in their own drawings. Participants will need the printable Hand Drawing Activity or a blank piece of paper and drawing utensils for this activity.

Conclusion

Takeaway

Hecht encourages students to continue showing courage. She provides information on other Nocturnals early reader books which explore different SEL themes. There is also information on the complete SEL guide for educators and more activities and video content on NocturnalsWorld.com.
