
"I'm bored!" Bismark said.

We do that every night!"




"Bismark," Dawn chimed in.

"Did you see the sparkle sprite?" she asked.


"Which way did it go?"

Suddenly, a tiny light flickered past


Karina's nose.


"There it goes!" Karina cried.

What are The Nocturnal Animals?



Pangolin: The pangolin is covered with keratin scales on most of its body except its belly and face. A pangolin sprays a stinky odor, much like a skunk, to ward off danger. It then curls into a ball to protect against attack. Pangolins have long, sticky tongues to eat ants and termites. Pangolins do not have teeth.

Red Fox: The red fox has reddish fur with a big, bushy tail and a white tip. Red foxes are clever creatures with keen eyesight. They have large, upright ears to hear sounds far away.





Sugar Glider: The sugar glider is a small marsupial. It looks like a flying squirrel. It has short gray fur, black rings around its big eyes, and a black stripe that runs from its nose to the end of its tail. Sugar gliders have special skin that stretches from the ankle to the wrist. This special skin allows sugar gliders to glide from tree to tree to find food and escape danger.

Kinkajou: The kinkajou is a social animal that lives in treetops. Kinkajous are able to turn their feet backward to run easily in either direction along branches and tree trunks. They have a tail that is longer than their head and body and that acts as another hand. Sometimes they are called honey bears because they raid bees' nests to slurp honey from hives.




Nighttime Fun Facts!

Nocturnal animals are animals that are awake and active at night. They sleep during the day.



Firefly: The firefly is a bug that lights up in a yellow, green, or blue pattern that is unique to its species. The Nocturnal Brigade calls them "sparkle sprites" and uses them to inspire their imaginations.

(swich-uh-roo) *noun* a change, especially a surprising or secret one
